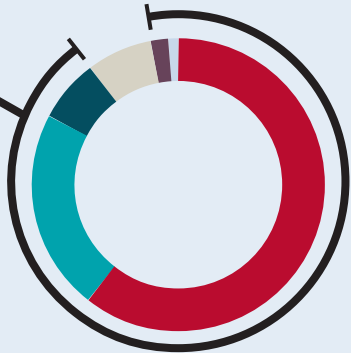

DATES AND DEADLINES



EARLY ACTION PROS

- Decision in late November or early December
- Admits can submit the Housing registration fee earlier
- Admits are considered for auto-admission to the Honors College
- Access to apply for the Foundation Fellowship scholarship

EARLY ACTION CONS

- Less time to work on the first-year application
- Less time to take the SAT or ACT
- Initial review doesn't include senior year grades
- Need to be comfortable with being deferred and waiting for a final decision in mid-to-late March

REGULAR DECISION PROS

- More time to work on essay and the first-year application
- More time to take the SAT or ACT
- Some senior grades will be available for review
- Less uncertainty, final decision will be admit or deny

REGULAR DECISION CONS

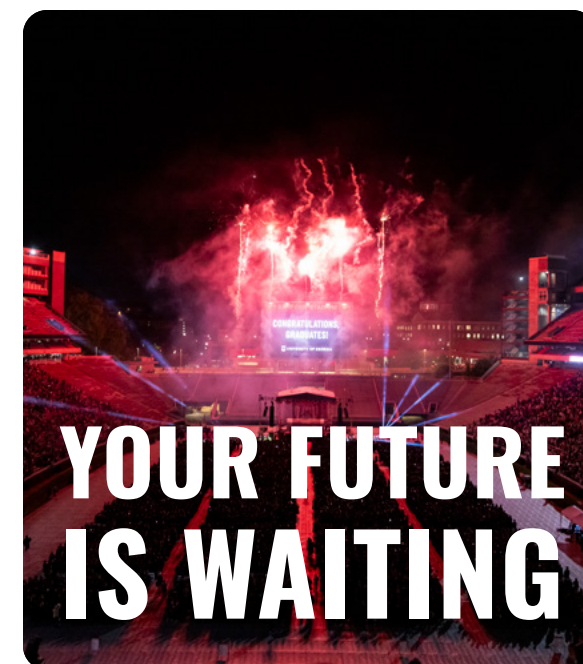
- Final decisions will be released in mid-to-late March
- Housing registration fee is submitted after Early Action admits
- Must apply to the Honors College

FIRST-YEAR APPLICATION CHECKLIST

- ❑ Application for admission (Common App)
- ❑ \$70 non-refundable fee or fee waiver
- ❑ Official high school transcript
- ❑ Counselor/school evaluation form
- ❑ Official SAT/ACT scores directly from the testing agency
- ❑ Teacher recommendation (optional)

TRANSFER APPLICATION CHECKLIST

- ❑ Application for admission (including a purpose statement)
- ❑ \$70 non-refundable application fee
- ❑ Official transcript(s) from every institution previously attended
